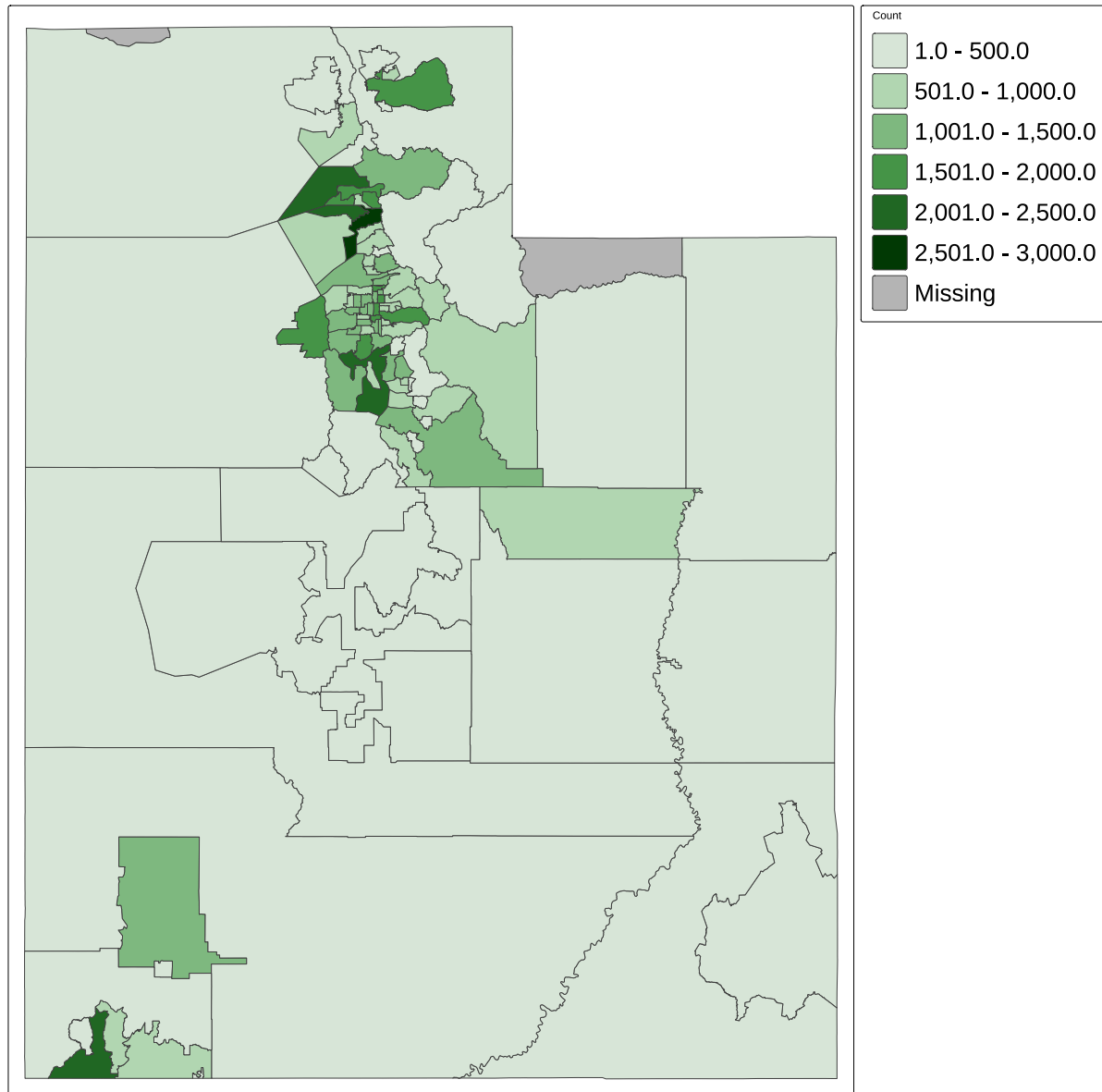

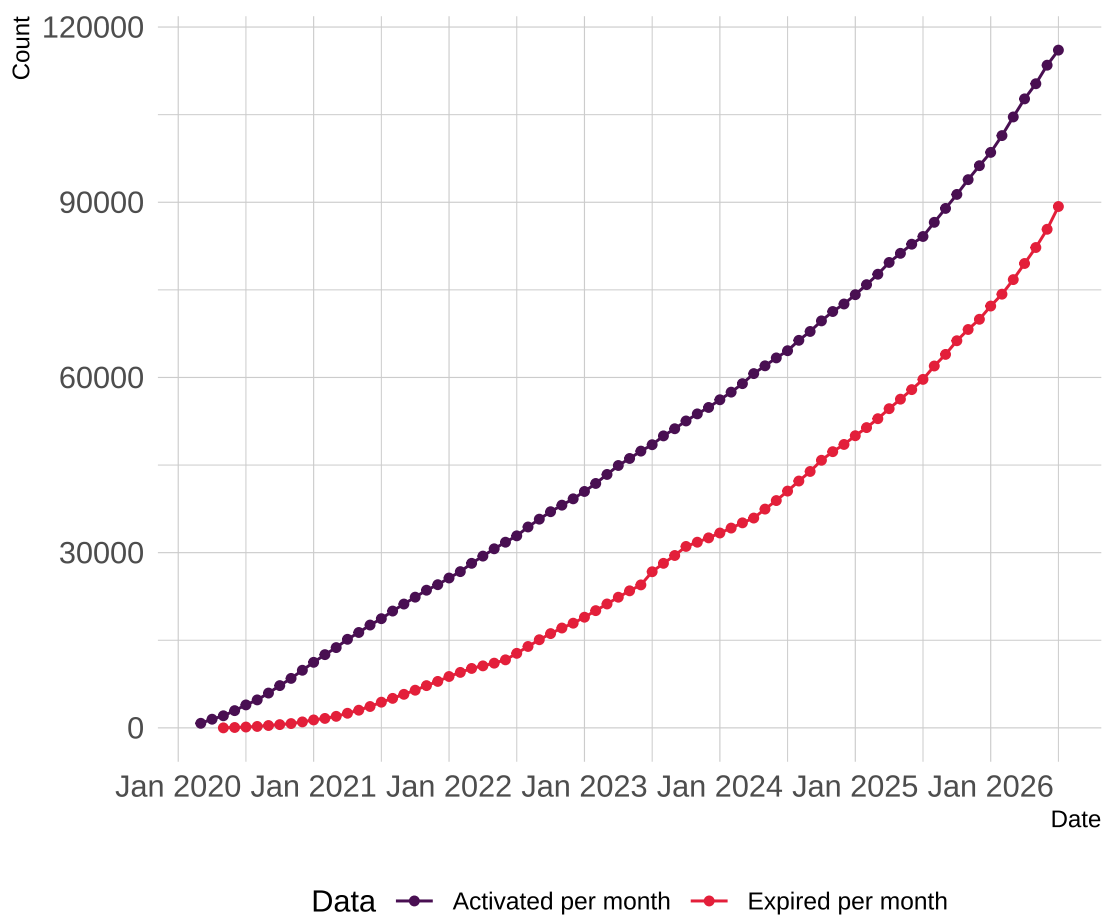




Medical cannabis cardholder growth

Cumulative current active and expired patients

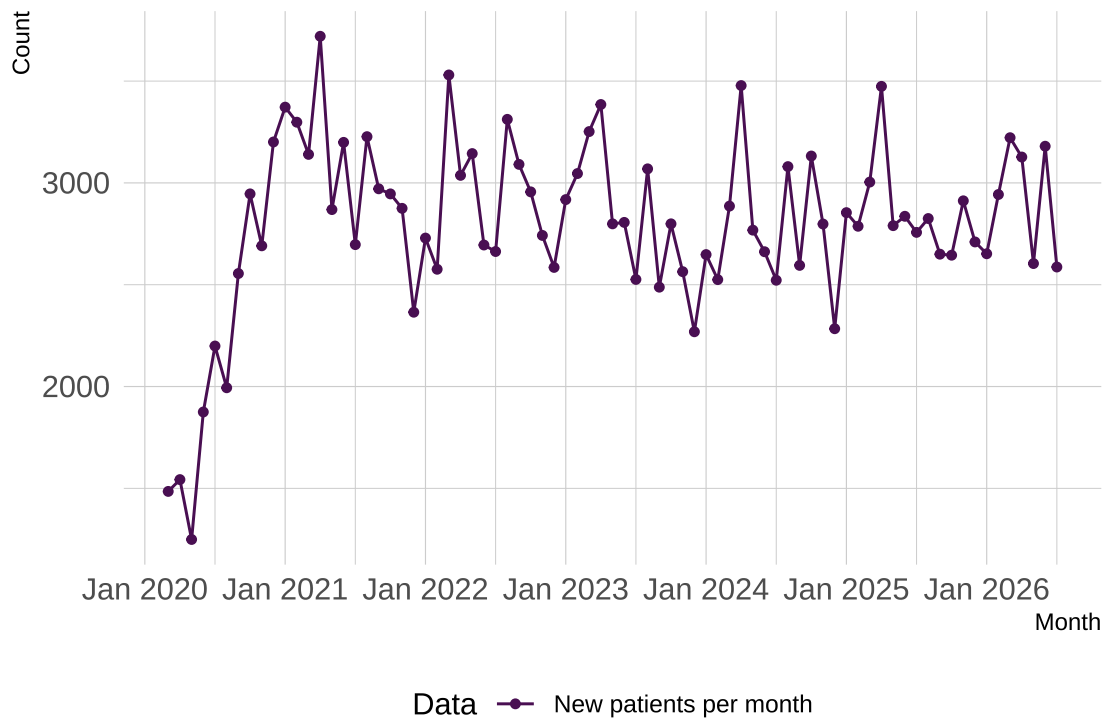

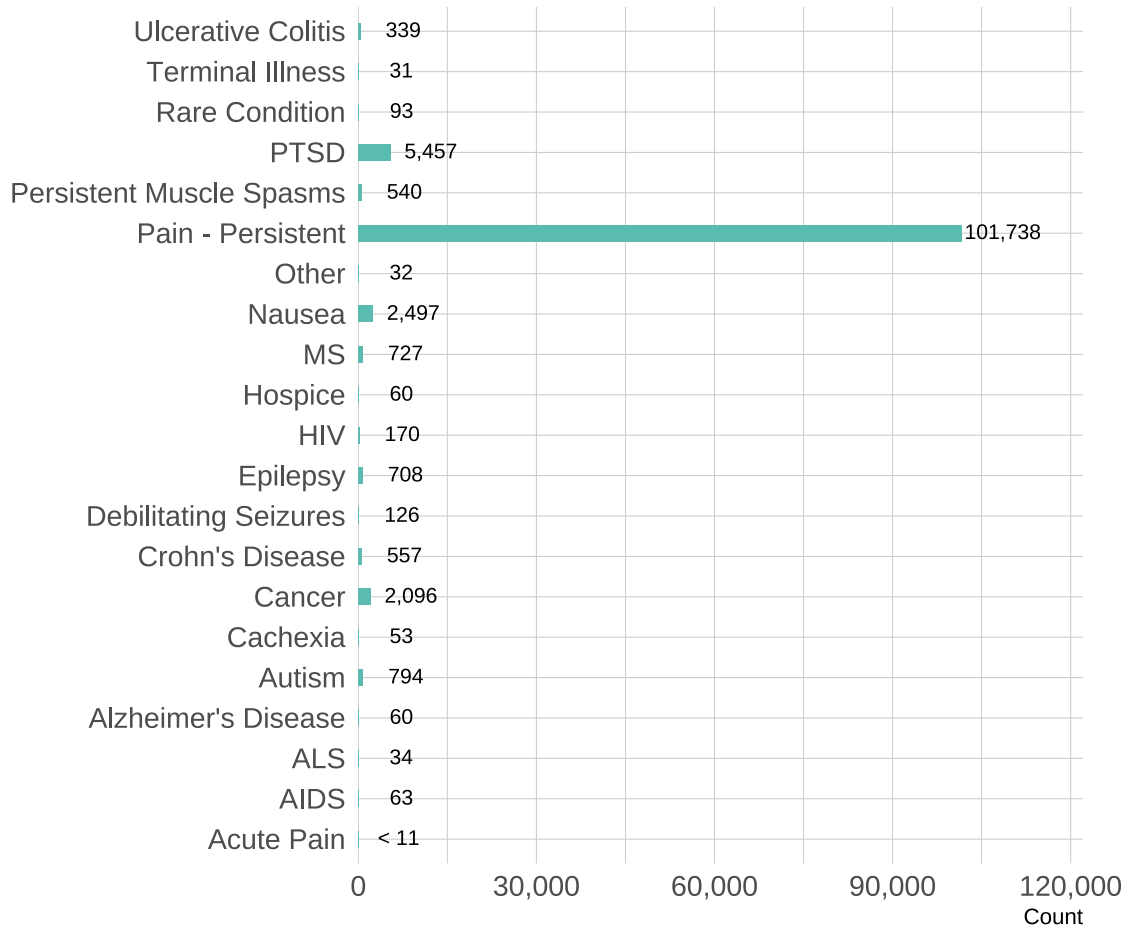

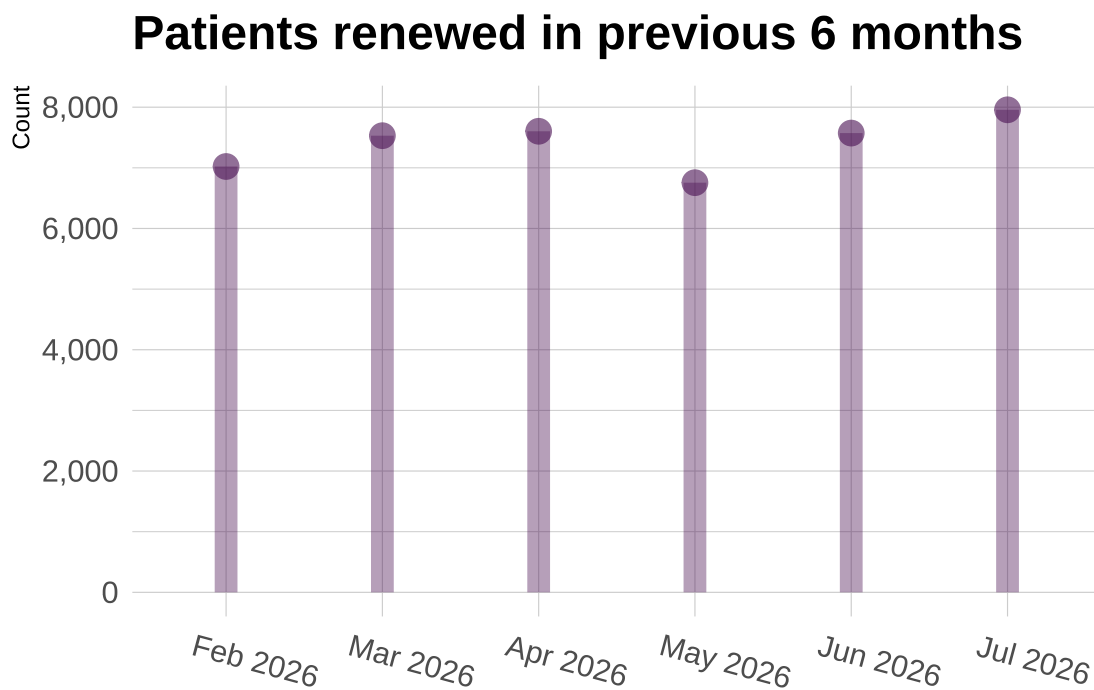

This chart counts the renewal per patient based on only their most recent renewal.



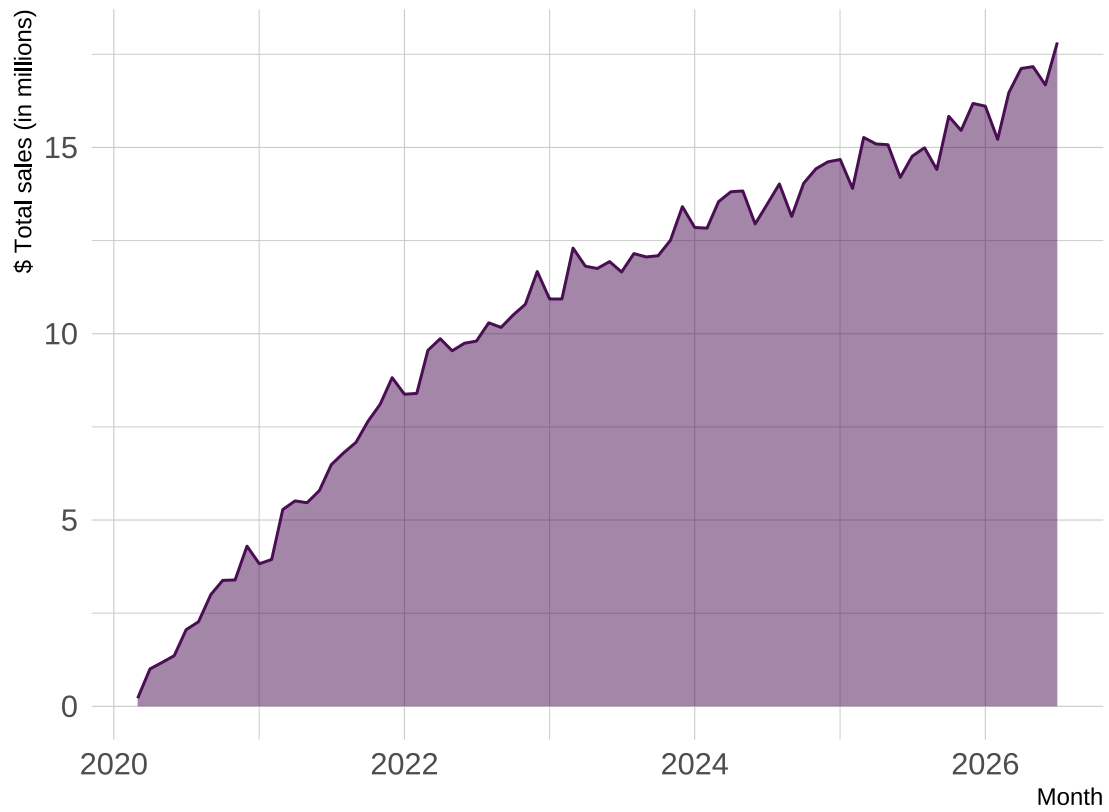

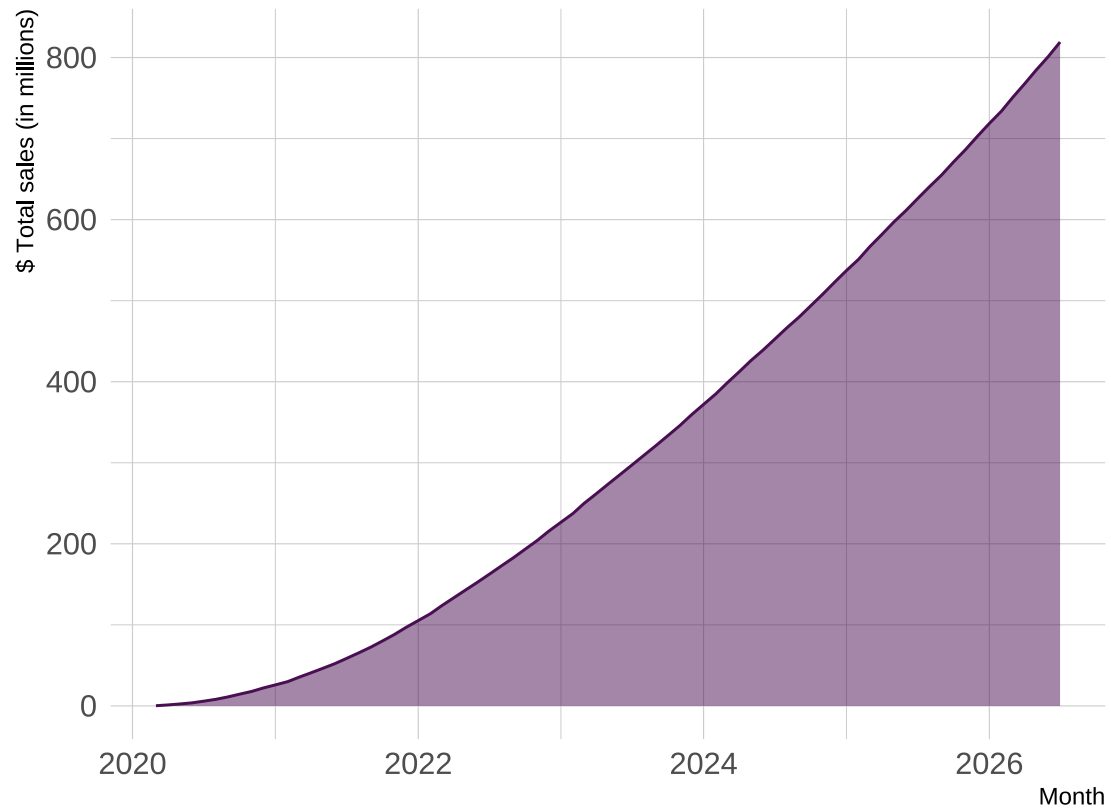

Month-to-month sales in \$



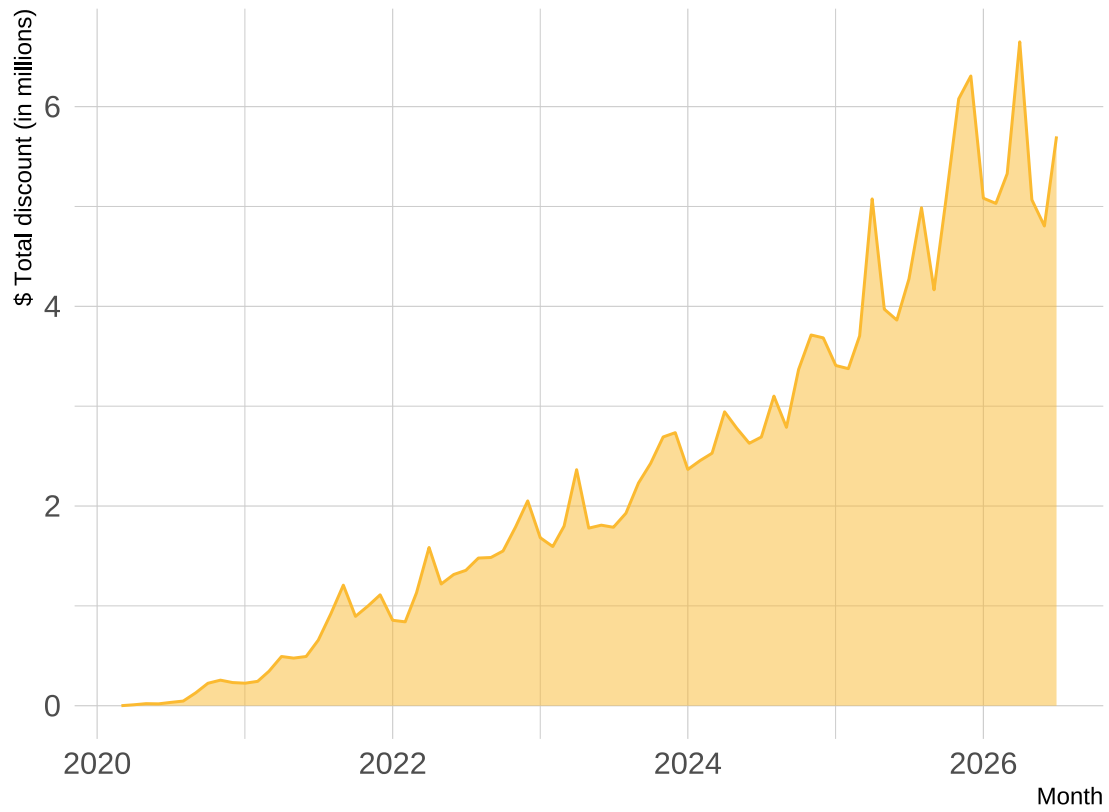


Cumulative sales in \$





Total order discount at pharmacies



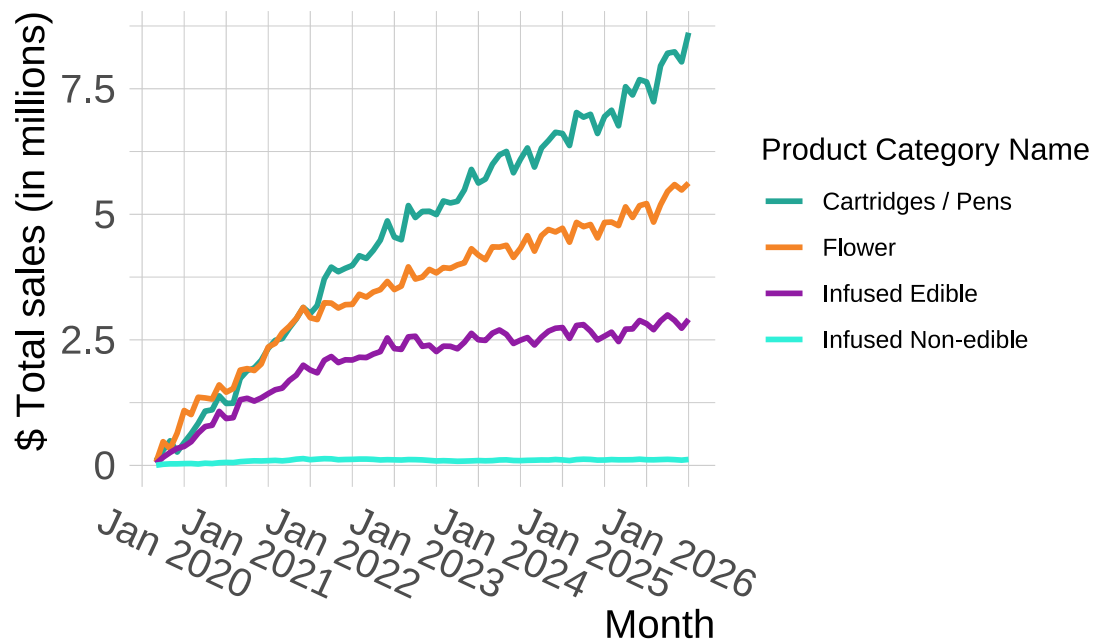

Sales per type over time in \$





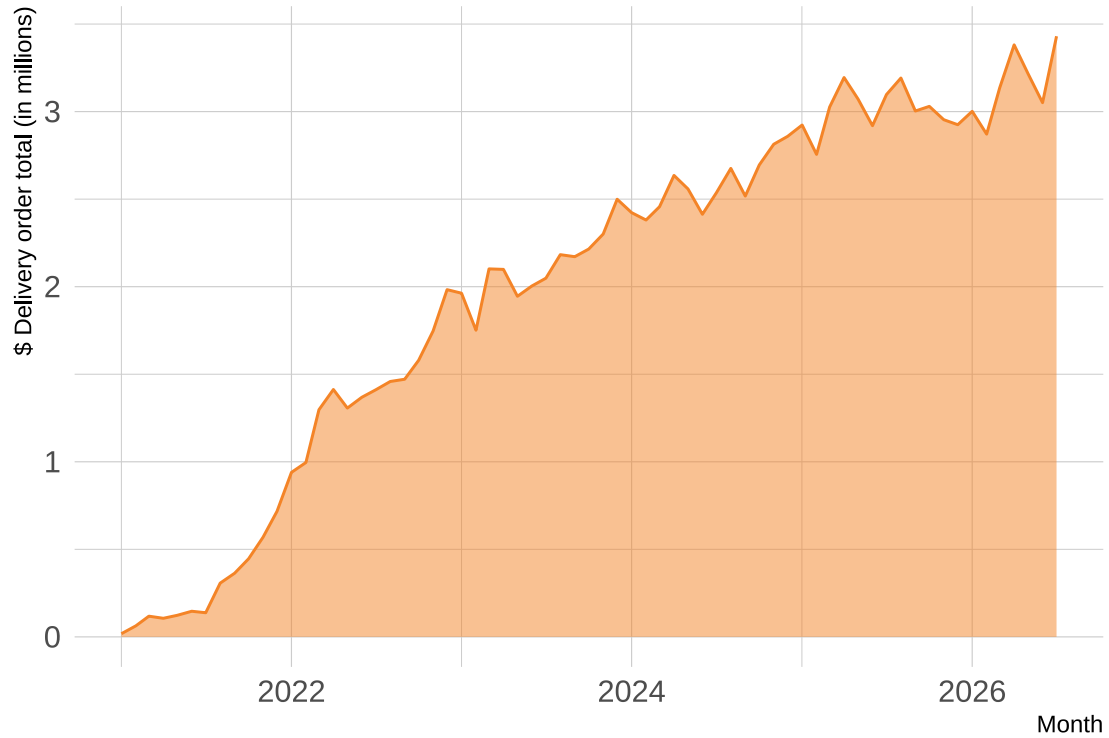

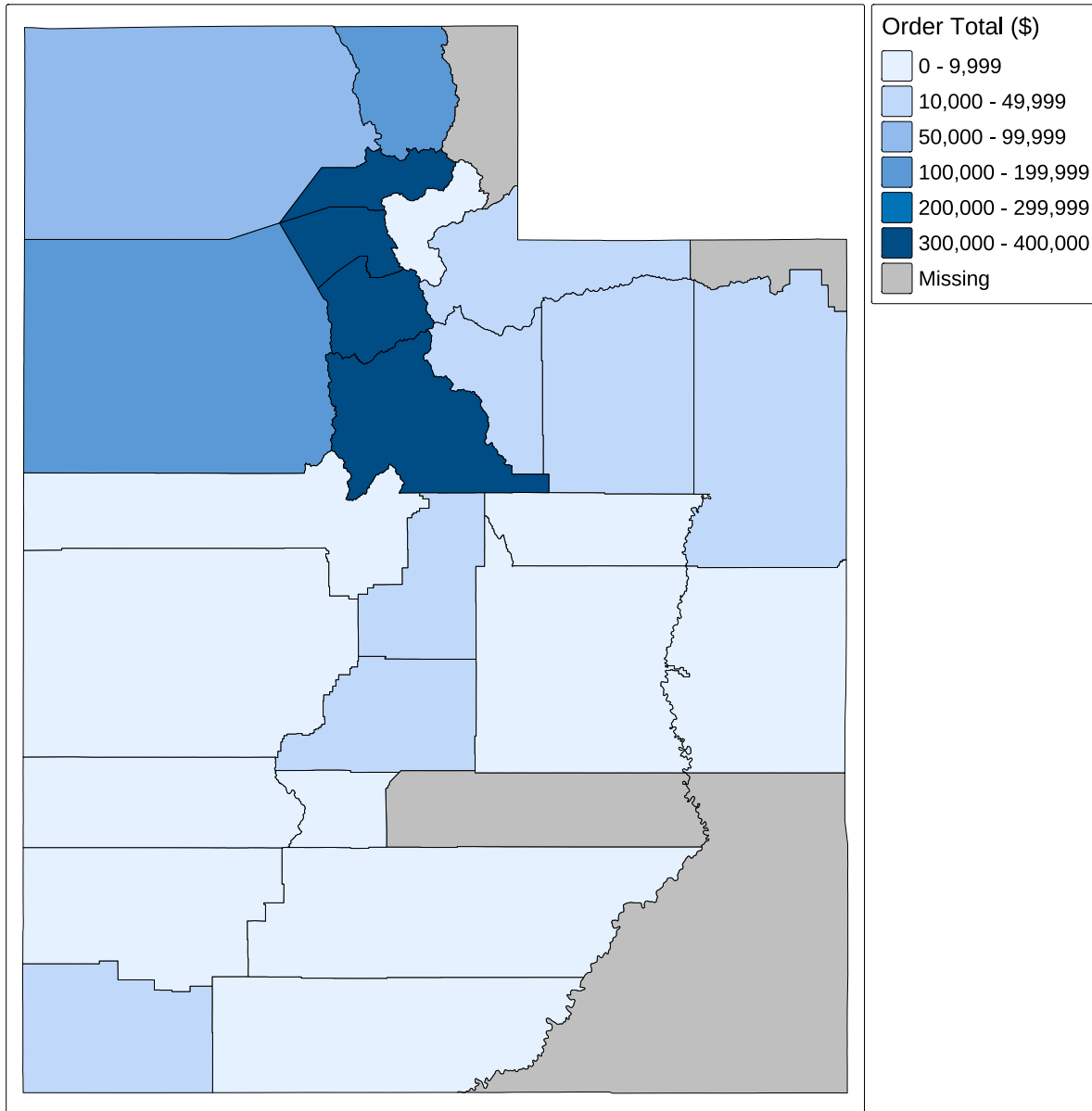

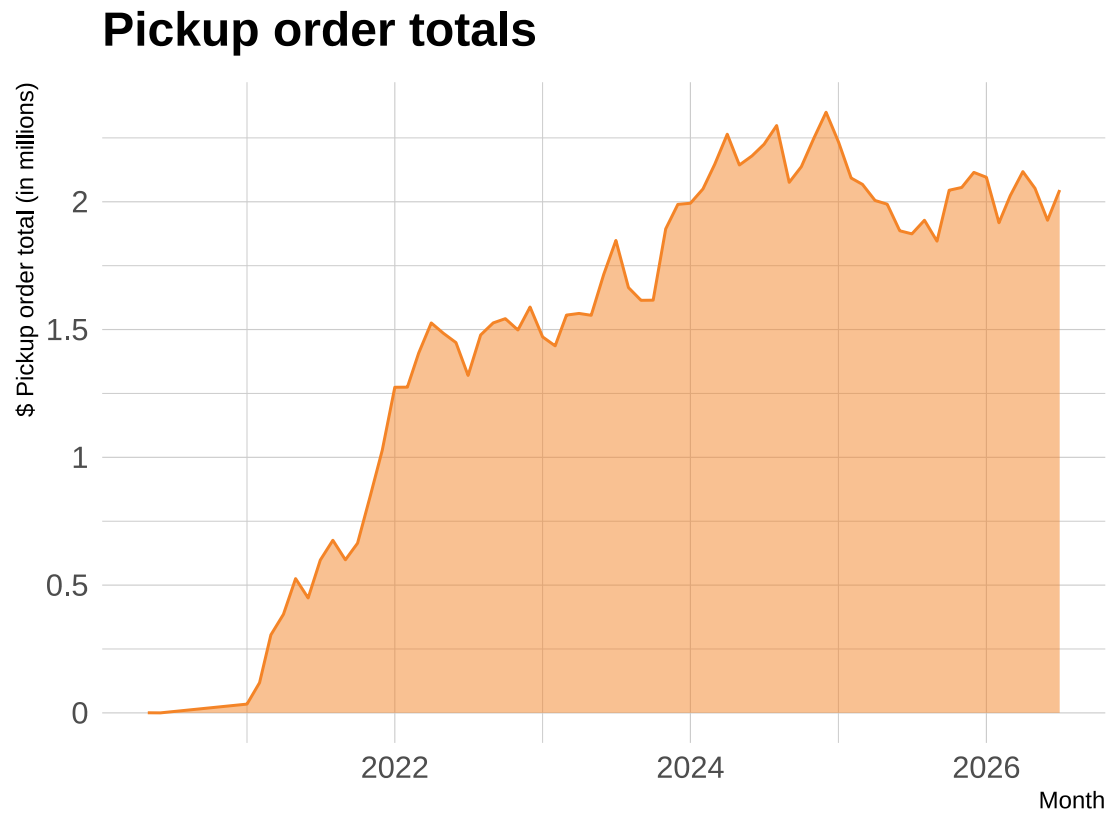
Deliveries by county

Deliveries per county for month





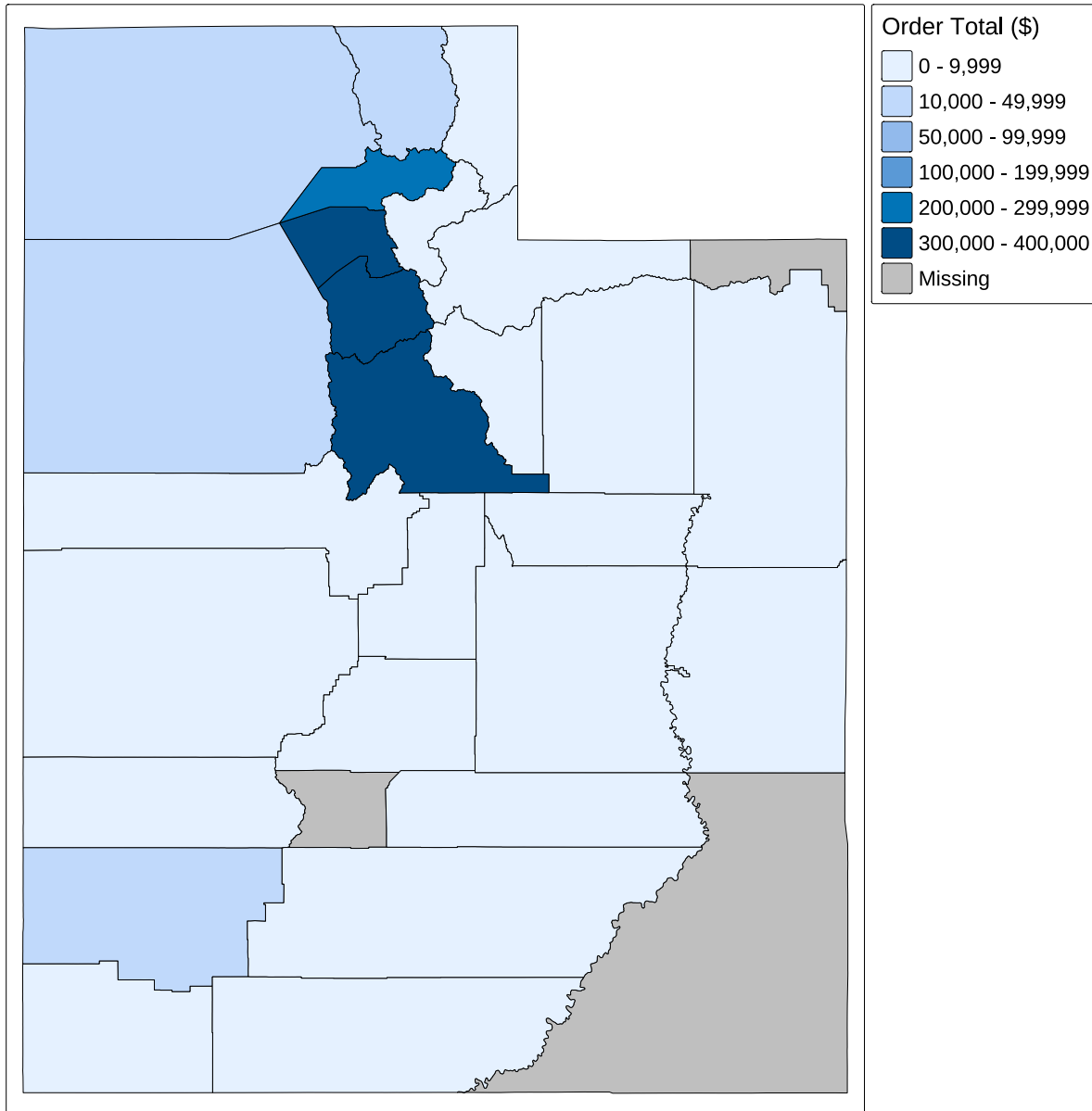

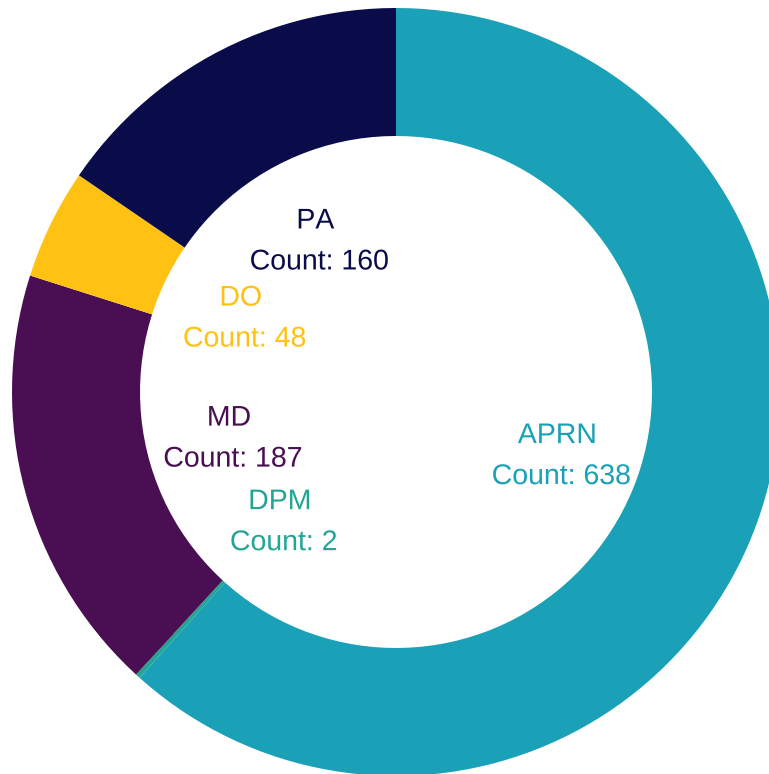

Amount of cannabis that licensees manufacture into cannabis products

Medical cannabis biomass is used to manufacture various medical cannabis products such as prepackaged flower, vape cartridges, gummies, tinctures, concentrates (e.g., hash rosin, live resin, budder, wax), and other approved medicinal dosage forms. Subcategories of flower such as trim and fresh/frozen, are generally used in processing runs to make cannabis derivative products.

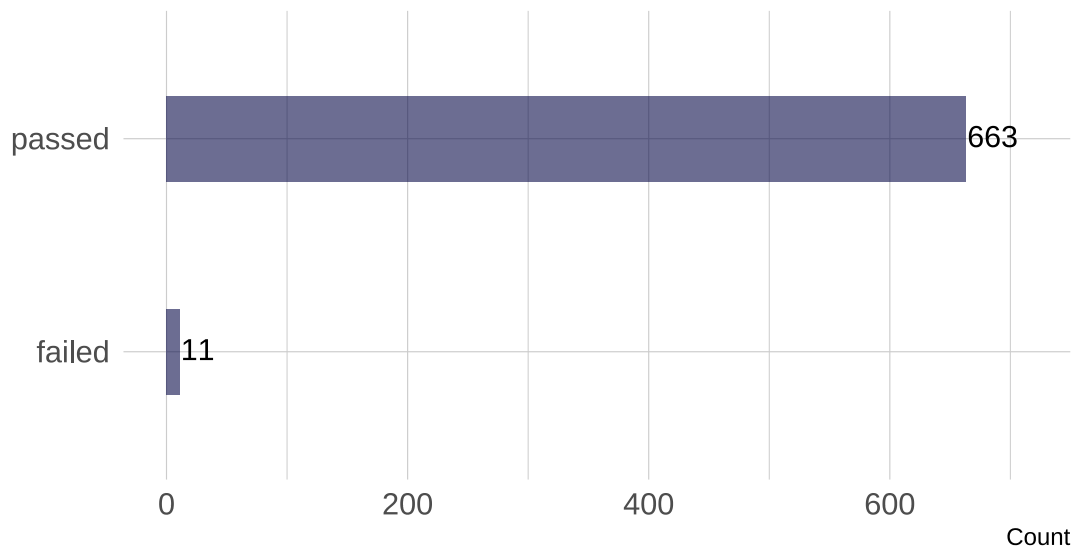

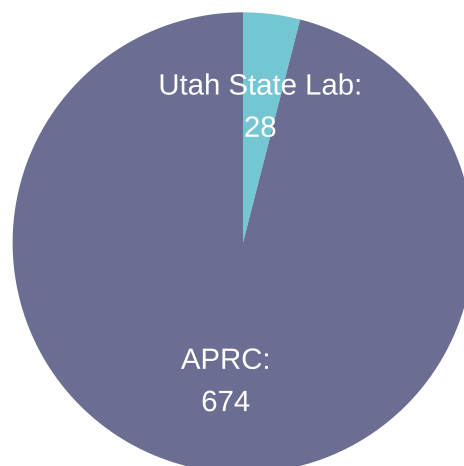

Definitions

- Pharmacy Agent: Employee at a Utah Medical Cannabis pharmacy
- Pharmacy Medical Provider (PMP): Pharmacist at a Utah Medical Cannabis Pharmacy
- Recommending Medical Provider (RMP): Utah-licensed physicians (MD, DO), advanced practice registered nurses, and physician assistants who are registered through the Utah Department of Health's Electronic Verification System (EVS) to recommend cannabis. RMPs may also submit recommendations using paper-only applications that do not require registering in EVS.
- Utah Department of Agriculture (UDAF): The Utah Department of Agriculture regulates Utah cannabis cultivators, processors, and manages lab testing.
- Utah Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS): The Utah Department of Health regulates medical cannabis pharmacies, medical recommendations, and patients.

Patient information

Data for patient, RMP, PMP, and pharmacy agent counts are obtained from the Electronic Verification System (EVS).

Which boundary a patient resides in was determined using [UGRC's](#) geocoding API. These counts do not include PO Box addresses or addresses entered in a format that the API cannot parse. Boundaries with 11 or fewer patients will have NA as their count.

Cardholder growth

'New Patients Per Month' are new unique patient activations per month. Patients in these counts may no longer be active.

'Activated Per Month' Counts are based on *current* active patients. The month is determined by when they were first made active. Since these counts are based on current active patients, counts in previous months may change as patients expire and renew.

'Expired per Month' Counts are based on currently expired patients organized by the month of their most recent expiration.

The 'Renewals Per Month' is the count of unique patients who had a card renewed any given month. Patients who have never renewed are excluded.

'Activations and Renewals per Month' is the count of unique patients who had either a card activated or renewed any given month.
